Hon'ble President of India visited Bangladesh



Meeting between Hon'ble President of Bangladesh Md. Abdul Hamid and Hon'ble President of India Shri Ram Nath Kovind at Bangabhaban on 15 December 2021

t the invitation of H.E. Abdul Hamid, Hon'ble President of Bangladesh, President of India H.E. Shri Ram Nath Kovind paid a State Visit to Bangladesh on 15-17 December 2021. On the

occasion of three epochal events: Birth Centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the Golden Jubilee of the Independence of Bangladesh and establishing diplomatic relations with India, he attended the Victory Day celebrations as the Guest of Honour. Smt. Savita Kovind, First Lady of India, Dr. Subhas Sarkar, Minister of State for Education, Shri Rajdeep Roy, Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha) and Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla, Foreign Secretary were part




of the delegation accompanying the President.

The President of India commenced his visit by paying homage at the National Martyrs' Memorial in Savar and subsequently at Bangabandhu Memorial Museum at 32. Dhanmondi. The visiting President held talks with the President of Bangladesh at Bangabhaban. Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina called on the Indian President and both

sides took stock of the progress in bilateral relations. Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP, Hon'ble Foreign Minister also called on the Indian President and discussed ongoing bilateral cooperation.

President of India's State Visit to Bangladesh took place after eight years. For the first time in the history of Bangladesh, any Head of State attended the celebration of Bangladesh's Victory Day. Moreover,

this was President Kovind's maiden visit to Bangladesh and his first overseas visit since the onset of COVID-19 pandemic. Earlier, the Prime Minister of India paid a landmark State Visit to Bangladesh on 26-27 March 2021. The visits of Prime Minister and President of India to any country in the same year is unprecedented in history. These visits manifest the renewed momentum in Bangladesh-India bilateral ties.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina visited Maldives

On 22 December 2021, Hon'ble Prime Minister H.E. Sheikh Hasina arrived in the Maldives for a state visit at the invitation of the Hon'ble President of Maldives H.E. Ibrahim Mohamed Solih. During the visit, Hon'ble Prime Minister was accompanied by Hon'ble Foreign Minister, Hon'ble Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Hon'ble Minister of Expatriates' Welfare & Overseas Employment, Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary), Chief of Army Staff, Chairman of National Board of Revenue, Senior Secretary (PMO) and high officials of Ministry of Foreign Affairs and

Prime Minister's Office. Upon arrival at Velana International Airport, the Hon'ble Prime Minister was received by the Acting Foreign Minister of Maldives H.E. Ahmed Khaleel. She was accorded ceremonial welcome at the airport with guard.

The formal reception ceremony for the Prime Minister was held on 23 December 2023 at Male' Republic Square. Upon her arrival at Male' VIP Jetty by the Presidential Boat with her entourage. Bangladesh Prime Minister was received by the President of Maldives, H.E. Ibrahim Mohamed Solih. She was greeted by the song and dance of school students as she walked to the saluting dais for Guard of Honour and then accorded ceremonial welcome with Guard of Honour in presence of Maldivian President. Gun salutes were made and national anthems of both the

countries were played while the two leaders were on the dais. They were then introduced to the Line of Presentation. Thereafter, Hon'ble Prime Minister proceeded to the President's Office accompanied by a cultural procession.

Upon arrival at the President's Office, Hon'ble Prime Minister signed the Visitor's Book. Thereafter, the two leaders attended exclusive talks accompanied by Hon'ble Foreign Ministers and Foreign Secretaries of both countries.

This was followed by the bilateral talks between the two sides. The two leaders elaborately discussed the areas of cooperation between Bangladesh and Maldives including economic and trade cooperation, consular and community issues, regional and international cooperation in the bilateral talks. After delegation-level talks, dignitaries of two sides witnessed signing of bilateral instruments in the area of health cooperation, avoidance of double taxation, youth and sports development.

Sheikh Hasina virtually delivered her valuable speech at the reception.



Life and legacy of two contemporary political giants-Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and former Australian Prime Minister Gough Whitlam were celebrated at a unique seminar in Sydney on 8 December 2021. A photo and documentary exhibition on Bangabandhu Whitlam Prime Minister followed by the seminar. Bangladesh High Commission in Canberra and Bangladesh Consulate General Sydney in association with the Whitlam Institute, Western Sydney University organized this Parramatta South Campus Chancellery, Western Sydney University (WSU). Legacies of Bangabandhu and Whitlam, their political philosophy on emancipation empowerment of people, multiculturalism, self-determination, and their commitment to regional and global peace were recollected in the seminar, chaired by Professor Peter Shergold, Chancellor of the WSU. Foreign Minister, Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP virtually addressed the seminar as Chief Guest while the former Australian Foreign Minister Mr. Gareth Evans delivered opening remarks from the Australian side. Hon'ble Foreign Minister delivered keynote speech at the 2021 Seoul Peacekeeping Ministerial




Hon'ble Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP reiterated Bangladesh's enduring commitment to global peace at the 2021 Seoul Peacekeeping Ministerial (UNPKM) hosted by the Republic of Korea on 08 December 2021. Speaking at a session on "Sustaining Peace" as a keynote speaker, he reflected on the

contribution made by Bangladesh peacekeepers in maintaining global peace and security. He also highlighted Bangladesh's leadership role in advancing a culture of peace and also in mainstreaming women in peace and security agenda through the adoption of the landmark resolution 1325. Hon'ble Foreign Minister underscored the need for ensuring nationally-owned inclusive and peace-building process for realizing peacebuilding and sustaining peace agenda in conflict-affected countries. He emphasized on programmatic funding for sustaining peace in peacekeeping missions. Welcoming Seoul initiative on technology and medical capacity building in Peacekeeping, he highlighted that COVID-19 challenges reinforced the importance of medical capacity building in peacekeeping missions for enhancement of safety and security of peacekeepers. During the meeting, Bangladesh pledged, among others, to provide two Aero-medical Evacuation Team, Air Transportation Unit, Aviation Security Unit and one Francophone Formed Police Unit. The two-day long conference focused on solidifying global partnership for peace with concrete commitments by Member States.



Hon'ble Foreign Minister delivered keynote speech at the 14th Bali Democracy forum



Hon'ble Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP reaffirmed Bangladesh's commitment democracy and development at the 14th Bali Democracy Forum hosted by Indonesia on 09 December 2021. Speaking at a session on "Democracy and Humanity: Addressing inequality" as one of the panellists, he reflected on the democratic journey and people-centric development model of Bangladesh. "In its response to the pandemic, the Government has remained true to our democratic values. We have placed vulnerable section of our society at the center of our recovery plan so that no one is left behind", Hon'ble Foreign Minister

told the attending dignitaries about Bangladesh's pro-people **COVID** management approach. He also highlighted the role of Bangladesh's appropriate legal framework. institutional reforms, vibrant civil society, numerous press and media outlets in the flourishing democracy of the country. He underscored the need for equal voice of all nations in all decision making process for a democratic global governance. He reiterated his call for equitable access to vaccine through dose donation as well as through patent waiver, knowledge sharing and capacitybuilding of the countries of global South. He also highlighted the role of education as an "enabler of democracy". He called for addressing the increasing "digital divide" by focusing on increased collaboration at regional and international level to promote democratic principles by sharing best practices.

Bangladesh High Commission in Colombo in association with the Palliative Care Trust and Cancer Care Association of Sri Lanka celebrated the Birth Centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the Golden Jubilee of the Independence of Bangladesh on 12 December 2021 at the Institute of Palliative Care Medicine in Matara, Sri Lanka. At the event,

Bangladesh High Commission awarded "Bangabandhu Memorial Grant for Palliative Care" to the Palliative Care Trust (PCT) of Sri Lanka and "Golden Jubilee **Scholarships** for Blooming Flowers" to the Cancer Care Association (CCA) of Sri Lanka. The Bangabandhu Memorial grant was distributed among 100 cancer patients and their family members. The Golden Jubilee scholarships

were given to 50 children of cancer victims from around the country.

Turkish investment in Bangladesh. The Foreign Ministers of the two countries also discussed possibilities of the visit of the President of Turkey to Bangladesh in 2022.

Turkey Mosud Mannan, ndc were present on the occasion. In his speech, Ambassador Mosud Mannan mentioned that the Father of Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the greatest Bengali of



all time, the great architect of the independence of Bangladesh, was not only the leader of his country, he was also a great leader of the masses of the developing world. Hon'ble Foreign Minister, in his address, said that it is really a matter of pride and honour for the nation that a bust of Bangabandhu is being inaugurated at the Capital City of Turkey. Hon'ble Foreign Minister inaugurated new Bangladesh Visa Application Centre in Kolkata

New Bangladesh Visa Application Centre (BDVAC) was inaugurated by Hon'ble Foreign Minister H. E. Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP on 16 December 2021 on virtual platform. Residents from the six Indian States- West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Sikkim can now submit their applications at the first official visa application centre located at the 1st Floor of Infinium Digispace, CP Block,

Block No 15, Salt Lake Sector V, Kolkata 700091 between 9 am & 3 pm and collect their passport from 1 pm to 6 pm Monday to Friday every week. The new visa application centre (VAC) spread over 13,000 sq ft is the largest single country visa application facility in Kolkata and will ensure applicants' seamless experience in acquiring their visas to travel to Bangladesh. The processing fee for all categories of visas is

Rs 700 + GST per application. No additional visa fee is applicable for Indians applying for the visas to Bangladesh. The new arrangements will ensure an enhanced applicantfriendly experience compared to the earlier system under which applicants had to submit their applications and documents directly at the Bangladesh Deputy High Commission.

The 26th Session of the Council of the International Seabed Authority (ISA) was held on 06-10 December 2021 at Kingston, Jamaica under the Presidentship of Bangladesh. All 36 Member States of the Council attended the Session either inperson or virtually. Rear Admiral (Retd.) Md. Khurshed Secretary (Maritime Affairs Unit) of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh presided the Session as the elected President of the Council of ISA. In his opening remarks, Rear Admiral (Retd.) Md. Khurshed Alam highlighted the strength of ISA as an organization in regulating and controlling all mineral-related activities in the international seabed area for the benefit of mankind as a whole and urged all the Member States to abide by the framework provided by the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) to ensure the effective protection of the marine environment from harmful effects that may arise from deep-seabed related activities. In his



welcome remarks, Secretary General of ISA highlighted the Authority's achievements and progress amid the pandemic and urged all Member States to remain vigilant to ensure benefits of Oceans shared by all.

Session. the Council approved applications for extensions of contracts in accordance with the procedures and criteria for the extension of an approved plan of work for exploration; report of the Finance Committee on the issue of

the equitable sharing of benefits and report of the Special Representative for the Enterprise; a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) and International Seabed Authority (ISA). The report of the Secretary General on the status of national legislation related to seabed mining and related matters was also approved by the Council.

The Council decided to complete the drafting of regulations for exploitation



of mineral resources in the Area by June 2023 by establishing informal working groups. The Chair of the Legal and Technical Commission presented the report on the work of the Commission. The Member States

took note of the report and provided their suggestions and guidelines especially on measures to preserve marine biodiversity. The Secretary General presented report on the implementation of the strategic plan

and high-level action plan of the ISA for the period of 2029-2023. The Council meeting was followed by the meeting of the Assembly on 13-15 December 2021.





She touched upon the history of the formation of Parliamentarians' Caucus on Migration & Development. She also talked about budget shortage, policy loopholes, and the problems of going through middlemen.

Nurul Amalina Shakinah Binti Haji Jainal, Social Media and Outreach Programme Assistant of Bangladesh High Commission delivered presentation on 'Relevant Labour Laws of Brunei'.

Acknowledging the trials and tribulations of the lives of migrant workers, Mr. Yusuf Halim expounded his views on the legal dimension of the problems faced by migrant workers. He identified the lack of proper language and communication skills, and the over-reliance on authorities as two major problems suffered by the Bangladeshi workers. 
Consulate General of Bangladesh in Istanbul launched Bangladesh Language Course at Istanbul University
