Austrian Chancellor exchanged greetings with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations



ustrian Chancellor Karl Nehammer exchanged greetings over phone Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on the occasion of Golden Jubilee of diplomatic relations of the two countries on 04 February 2022. The Chancellor expressed that Austria wanted to remain as a

partner in Bangladesh's development journey and further strengthen economic ties with the country. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina urged the Chancellor to come up with more investment in Bangladesh; specially, in the economic zones. She thanked Chancellor Nehammer for providing with 1.5 million Bangladesh

coronavirus vaccines to Bangladesh as gift. Karl Nehammer said that his country was ready to provide more vaccines if Bangladesh needs so in future. Prime Minister Hasina invited Chancellor Nehammer to visit in the near future which the Chancellor accepted gladly.

Hon'ble Prime Minister held video conference with Luxembourg's Prime Minister marking 50 years Bangladesh-Luxembourg diplomatic relations

On 07 February 2022, Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina exchanged her greetings counterpart Mr. Xavier Bettel, Prime Minister of Luxembourg through a video conference on the occasion of the two countries completing 50 years of diplomatic relations. During the conversation, both Prime Ministers discussed a range of cooperation areas between the two countries. Prime

Minister Sheikh Hasina mentioned Luxembourg as a steady supporter and trusted partner in the ongoing socio-economic development journey of Bangladesh.



Prime Minister of Luxembourg highlighted the need to explore new opportunities to further widen and deepen the existing bilateral relations. He reaffirmed Luxembourg's support to Bangladesh regarding the repatriation of Rohingyas to their homeland Myanmar alongside. Both sides also expressed their collective willingness to boost trade and economic cooperation.

Highlighting that Bangladesh will officially graduate from the UN LDC category in 2026, Hon'ble Prime Minister sought cooperation of the Luxembourg government within the European Union for trade preferences such as the GSP+ during the postgraduation transition period. Prime Minister of Luxembourg agreed in principle to extend wholehearted support for Bangladesh.





Visit of high level South Sudanese delegation comprising Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, Deputy Minister of Defense and high officials of Trade and Commerce Ministries to Dhaka from 07-11 February 2022

A high-level delegation of the government of South Sudan paid official visit to Bangladesh from 07-11 February 2022. During the visit South Sudanese delegation met with Hon'ble Minister for Foreign Affairs, Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP at the State Guest House, Padma on 07 February 2022. At the meeting, Hon'ble Minister for Foreign Affairs, Dr. Momen stated that the visit was taking place at a very special moment of Bangladesh when the country was celebrating the twin programmes of Birth Centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the Golden Jubilee of our Independence. The South Sudanese Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs handed over the letter of the South Sudanese Minister of Foreign Affairs, addressed to

Hon'ble Foreign Minister focusing which on enhancing the bilateral relations between Bangladesh and South Sudan. Hon'ble Minister for Foreign Affairs proposed that both may conclude agreements which are under discussion by both sides. He also proposed that military officers of the Bangladesh and South Sudan may share knowledge in peace keeping area.





The visiting delegation also called upon Hon'ble State Minister for Foreign Affairs, Md. Shahriar Alam, MP at his office on 07 February 2022. During the call, both sides discussed bilateral issues of mutual interest and focused on identifying the potential avenues of co-operation. visiting delegation underscored the importance of mutual cooperation in bilateral platforms as well as cooperation at the UN.

During the visit to Dhaka, the South Sudanese delegation visited Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Memorial Museum and laid flower wreath as tribute to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman at the museum.

The South Sudanese delegation also met with the Dr. Abdur Razzaque, Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture, Secretary, Ministry of Commerce and Secretary, Ministry of Industries

Director General, of Manpower, Employment and Training.

They South Sudan delegation paid a visit to Bangladesh Agriculture Research Council (BARC), Dhaka and Nursing & Midwifery Education and Services in Bangladesh (NIANER) in Mugda, Dhaka. They also visited Pran-RFL group in Narsingdi, Walton production area in Savar and Beximco Industrial Park in Gazipur.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Embassy of Japan celebrated the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations

An event was organized jointly by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Embassy of Japan in Dhaka on 08 February 2022 at the Foreign Service Academy on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Bangladesh and Japan. Minister Sheikh Hasina and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida issued separate goodwill video messages

congratulating the people of the two friendly countries on this momentous occasion.

Japan officially recognized Bangladesh as an independent state on 10 February 1972. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, in her message, expressed the gratitude of the people of Bangladesh for the precious support and contributions of Japan and its people during Bangladesh's War of Liberation. She highlighted the historic visit of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to Japan in October 1973, which laid the foundation of a steadfast and lasting friendship between the two countries.

between the two countries, poised to be raised from "Comprehensive Partnership" to "Strategic Partnership" in the near future. She acknowledged the sustained economic cooperation and support of Japan and expressed the hope that the last fifty years' enviable cooperation would remain an inspiration for the coming fifty years for mutually beneficial gains.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, in his message, reiterated Japan's commitment to strengthen bilateral ties with Bangladesh. Highly appreciating the socio-economic progress of Bangladesh, he expressed his determination to work with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and the people of Bangladesh more closely to elevate bilateral relations between the two countries to new heights. Foreign Minister, Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary), and Ambassador of Japan to Bangladesh spoke at the celebration event.

As the Chief Guest of the ceremony, the Foreign Minister recalled with gratitude the moral and material support provided to us by the Government and people of Japan in our War of Liberation. He also paid deep respect to the "Friends of Bangladesh" from Japan, whom Bangladesh has awarded for their invaluable contributions independence of Bangladesh. He also expressed gratitude to Japan for being the largest development partner of Bangladesh. He stressed on the instrumental role of Japan as a key development partner in this endeavor. Ambassador of Japan Ito Naoki highlighted the robust multifaceted cooperation between the two countries, especially in the areas of infrastructure development, trade, investment and people-topeople contacts. 50 Years of Bangladesh-Italy diplomatic relations was celebrated

Abdul Momen, MP, Foreign Minister of Bangladesh addressed to H.E. Mr. Luigi di Maio, Foreign Minister of Italy on the occasion of 50 years of diplomatic relations between Bangladesh and Italy. During his meeting with the Secretary General, both of them recalled the excellent bilateral relations between the two countries while they discussed possible areas of cooperation to further strengthen bilateral cooperation. Mohamamd Jasim Uddin, Mr. Counsellor(Political) was also present.

Hon'ble Foreign Minister delivered lecture on the vision of Bangabandhu on world peace & security at Emirates Centre for Strategic Studies and Research (ECSSR)

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP highlighted the vision and philosophy of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman on world peace and security and its enduring relevance in today's global context in a lecture event on 11 February jointly organized by the Embassy of Bangladesh in Abu Dhabi and ECSSR at the Centre's conference hall in Abu Dhabi. Referring to Bangabandhu's foreign policy dictum



of 'Friendship to all, malice to none', his adherence to the policy of nonalignment, strong support to the cause of Palestinian people, his historic speech at the UNGA, being awarded the Julio Curie Peace Prize, Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP elaborated how Bangabandhu sacrificed his whole life to establish peace not only for his own people but also for the entire global community. He noted that the philosophy of Bangabandhu is still relevant and effective for establishing a world of peace, justice, tolerance and co-existence with independent space for the human life and the human dignity. The Foreign Minister pointed that following the path of Bangabandhu and under the leadership of the Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Bangladesh has been promoting a "Culture of Peace". Opening the border and giving shelter to 1.1 million forcibly displaced

Myanmar nationals in Bangladesh is a vivid testimony to country's policy of promoting culture of peace, he added.

More than one hundred distinguished participants including university teachers, students, academia, journalist, researchers, government high officials and member of the diplomatic corps attended interactive session.

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP held a bilateral meeting with the UAE Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah bins Zayed Al Nahyan on 13 February 2022 at Expo 2020 Dubai. During the meeting, both the Foreign Ministers reviewed the whole gamut of bilateral relations between the two countries especially in view of the expected visit of the Hon'ble Prime Minister to the UAE in March 2022. Among the issues, they highlighted mutual commitment to deeper political engagement, cooperation in trade, commerce, investment and

economic areas, enhanced air and maritime connectivity especially establishing direct shipping links between the two countries' seaports and introducing direct cargo flights to maintain seamless and uninterrupted supply chains. Momen congratulated the UAE



leadership and people on their 50th anniversary of their nationhood while appreciating the spectacular achievements during last five decades. In this regard, the two Foreign Ministers agreed to organize few special events to mark the twin golden jubilee of nationhood of Bangladesh and UAE.





Hon'ble Foreign Ministerjoined Munich Security Conference

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP along with Lieutenant General Waker-Uz-Zaman, Principal Staff Officer (PSO), Armed Forces Division joined the Munich Security Conference (MSC) on 18-20 February 2022 which was attended by the global leaders from both public and private sectors.

At a discussion panel concerning climate change-induced crisis, Foreign Minister drew attention to the possible consequences of climate-induced displacements in different parts of the world and mentioned that climate change poses a security challenge. He urged the global leadership to assist forging international partnerships to ensure financing and technologies for climate vulnerable countries like Bangladesh. The panel consisted of John Kerry, the climate envoy of the US President, Franziska Brantner, state secretary at the German Federal Minister for Economic Affairs and Climate Action, and Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber, Minister of Industry and



Advanced Technology of UAE which had been moderated by Zanny Beddeos, editor-in-chief, The Economist and the scene was set out by Professor Johan Rockstrum, Director of the Postdam Institute of Climate Impact Research.

In a separate session concerning the possible way out of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Foreign Minister reiterated the call for considering vaccines to be 'global public goods'

and ensuring vaccine equity around the world. In the presence of his counterparts from Canada, Sweden and Bill Gates, he stressed the need for transferring the technological know-how to developing countries like Bangladesh for vaccine production.

Foreign Minister had a meeting with Mr. John Kerry where Ambassador of Bangladesh to Germany was also present. There were discussions concerning the possibilities of widened



cooperation in the areas of climate actions. Mr. Kerry took interest in the project envisaged for heightening and widening embankments with afforestation and renewable energy generation capacity along coastal belt of Bangladesh. The US Presidential envoy invited Bangladesh to join the Global Methane Pledge as a means to benefit from support for reducing emissions from solid waste. among other sectors.

Dr. Momen also held a meeting with the Foreign Minister of Australia and exchanged views on the issues of mutual concerns. Md. Mosharraf Hossain Bhuivan, the Ambassador of Bangladesh to Germany was also present during the meeting.




Hon'ble Foreign Minister informed UN about the Covid-19 management of the Government of Bangladesh




Hon'ble State Minister called for implementation of Paris Agreement

He further Salman emphasized on many topics including the strategic importance of the Association within the Indian Ocean region, and Bangladesh's role as the Chair to increase IORA's relevance to strengthen the implementation of actionable and practical projects for the region. In addition, Ambassador Momen highlighted the IORA-Dhaka Development Initiative which is currently underway focused on promoting regional integration, economic and sustainable development initiatives in the region. He also appreciated recent efforts towards the strengthening of the

IORA Secretariat and offered further support in this endeavor.

Two signing ceremonies were held on 15 February 2022 at the IORA Secretariat. The Annual Operation Plan for 2022 was signed between Rear Admiral (Retd.) Md. Khurshed Alam, Secretary, Maritime Affairs Unit and the IORA Secretary General, H.E. Mr Salman Al Farisi. The Financial Contribution Agreement was signed by the IORA Secretary General and Project Director for the German Development Agency (GIZ), aimed at further improving the service delivery capacity of the IORA Secretariat in Mauritius.

Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary) met dignitaries during his visit to Mauritius

Street. Both sides agreed to continue enhancing cooperation in trade, economic, and business relations and establish contacts between the apex chambers.

Ambassador Masud Bin Momen had a tete-e-tete with Foreign Secretary Mr. Haymandoyal. Foreign Secretary of Bangladesh requested to take collaborative projects where development partners would invest. Both sides agreed to establish cooperation in tourism, fisheries, and ocean economy areas under the IORA.

Foreign Secretary also met with the Minister of Labour & Commerce Mr. Soodesh Satkam Callichurn on



15 February. During this meeting, Mr. Callichurn proposed an FTA and requested the Bangladesh side to furnish the draft agreement.

Foreign Secretary handed over to him a draft MoU on ICT cooperation between Bangladesh and Mauritius during this meeting and discussed with the IT Minister possible areas of cooperation. Foreign Secretary also visited a textile Factory in Port Louise where more than 1200 Bangladeshi skilled workers, mostly women, are employed.

Foreign Secretary visited Chennai and New Delhi in India

Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary) Ambassador Masud Bin Momen visited India from 23-25 February 2022 at the invitation of Indian Foreign Secretary Mr. Harsh Vardhan Shringla. Foreign Secretary met his Indian counterpart on 24 February 2022 where they discussed wide range of issues of mutual interests.

Both the Foreign Secretaries expressed satisfaction on the excellent bilateral relations that exist between the two countries. They noted that 2021 was a landmark year as both the countries were celebrating the 50th year of establishment of diplomatic relationship and witnessed the landmark visits of the President and the Prime Minister of India to Bangladesh. Foreign Secretary Momen sought India's cooperation in resolving the outstanding issues especially water sharing agreement of the common rivers and sought support in completing Shadhinota Sharak and handing over of the historic building at 8 Theatre Road, which served as the headquarters of the first Bangladesh Government in 1971.

Earlier, on 23 February 2022 Foreign Secretary visited the newly opened Bangladesh Deputy High Commission Chennai. in exchanged his views with Mission's officials and urged them to work sincerely to promote relations with all the southern states of India and



extend necessary consular assistance for thousands of Bangladeshis visiting every year to these cities for medical treatments. High Commissioner of Bangladesh to India Muhammad Imran, Secretary (East) Ambassador

Mashfee Binte Shams and Director General (South Asia) Mr. Rokebul Haque were among the delegation of the Foreign Secretary during the visit.

launch of "Bangabandhu-Thomas Williams QC Award" on 22 February 2022.

On the occasion, recalling the contribution of Sir Thomas Williams commemorative function organised by Bangladesh High Commission, London, the High Commissioner said, "Sir Thomas Williams went to Pakistan in 1968 as a defence lawyer for Bangabandhu and the other accused in the Agartala



case under the patronisation of the expatriate Bangladeshis in the UK. The Bangladesh High Commission, London has introduced this award to highlight the significance of his historic role and his friendly relationship with Bangabandhu." Hugh Burns, a prominent British writer and journalist and president of the All European Bangabandhu Council, was the special guest at the event and thanked the Bangladesh High Commission, London "Bangabandhuintroducing the Thomas Williams QC Award".

The award will be given outstanding contribution to development of Bangladesh-UK alliance and common values of the two countries.

Hugh Burns's father, Michael Burns, a prominent British politician and







former British MP, had long been the chairman of the All-European Bangabandhu Council. He supported the "Recognize Bangladesh-Release Sheikh Mujib-Stop Genocide" movement in 1971.

Sultan Mahmud Sharif, one of the organizers of the Great Liberation War in Bangladesh and Ansar Ahmed Ullah, vice president of All European Bangabandhu Parishad also spoke on the occasion.

Bangladesh Embassy in Rome facilitated repatriation of dead bodies of seven Bangladesh nationals

Bangladesh **Embassy** Rome successfully completed the repatriation process of seven deceased Bangladesh nationals who met tragic death recently in the Mediterranean near Lampedusa island of Italy due to hypothermia. They were on a boat carrying 287 migration aspirants among which 273 were reported by the Italian authorities as Bangladesh nationals. The first dead body reached Dhaka on 11 February 2022 by a direct flight from Catania, while the last dead body reached Dhaka on 21 February 2022. The Embassy played a coordinating role with the Italian authorities, Airlines and relevant Bangladeshi agencies in order to expedite repatriation of the human remains and also remained vigilant



disseminating the updated information to the family members. H.E. Mr. Md. Shameem Ahsan, Bangladesh Ambassador to Italy, Dr. Fransesco Micciche, Hon'ble Mayor of Agrigento, Sicily on 3 February, 2022 at the latter's office and expressed profound gratitude and deep appreciation to the Mayor for his overwhelming generosity following the tragic incident. The Mayor thanked the



Bangladesh Ambassador for being the first Envoy to visit his city and for the welfare of the community.

The Ambassador also met Ms. Maria Rita Cocciufa, Prefect of Agrigento Province, Sicily on 4 February 2022

and expressed profound gratitude for her all-out support following the tragic incident.

15 Bangladeshi students fleeing Ukraine war received at Hungary border by the Bangladesh Mission in Vienna

Bangladesh Mission in Vienna, in cooperation with the Hungarian Foreign Ministry, facilitated arrival in Hungary of 15 Bangladeshi medical students fleeing the war in Ukraine on 26 February 2022. Deputy Chief of Mission Rahat Bin Zaman, accompanied by the Honorary Consul of Bangladesh in Hungary Dr. Greg Pataki received them at the Hungary-Ukraine border. The Mission arranged accommodation for those students in the Semmelweis University dormitory in Budapest and provided all necessary supports including foods for a few weeks. The Mission later also managed to enroll those students in the Semmelweis Medical University to continue their



studies with the assistance henceforth provided by the University authority. Apart from the first batch of 15 students, the Mission coordinated arrival of 34 Bangladeshi

nationals, mostly students, from Ukraine. The Embassy also arranged repatriation of two Bangladeshi nationals to Bangladesh ta the cost of the government.

Bangladesh and European Investment Bank (EIB) signed 250 million Euros Loan contract to strengthen Covid-19 Public Health Programme

On 03 February 2022, Mr. Christian Kettel Thomsen, Vice President, European Investment Bank (EIB), and Mr. Mahbub Hassan Saleh. Ambassador of Bangladesh Belgium and Luxembourg and Head of Mission to the European Union, ceremonially announced at the EIB Headquarters in Luxembourg, the signing of the Finance Contract between Government of Bangladesh and European Investment Bank for a loan of 250 million Euros for procuring Covid-19 vaccines and countrywide immunization under





'Bangladesh Covid-19 Public Health Programme'.

This is so far the largest amount of loan provided by EIB to Government

of Bangladesh in the 22 years' journey of Bangladesh-EIB partnership.

Bangladesh Ambassador to Iraq met Senior Deputy Foreign Minister for Bilateral Relations of Iraq

Bangladesh Ambassador to Iraq H. E. Mr. Md. Fazlul Bari met the Senior Deputy Foreign Minister for Bilateral Relations of Iraq H.E. The President also expressed his gratitude for Bangladesh's assistance in critical areas of mutual interest, such as human resource development, higher education, healthcare, and economic cooperation.







Bangladesh becomes the President of the WFP Executive Board for the year 2022

The 36-Member Executive Board of the Rome-based WFP (World Food Programme) on 28 February 2022 in its first regular session unanimously elected Bangladesh as the President of the Board for the first time for the vear 2022. H.E. Mr. Md. Shameem Ahsan, Ambassador of Bangladesh to Italy and Permanent Representative to FAO, IFAD and WFP assumed the charges as President by acclamation of all member states. With the Presidency, Bangladesh will lead the Board supporting efforts of the WFP, world's largest humanitarian organization, in providing life-saving assistance in humanitarian crises, particularly in conflict affected countries and under the current COVID-19 pandemic, which is

lasting longer than expected. In his introductory remarks, Ambassador Ahsan reiterated that this organization has a crucial role to play in supporting food security for many of the world's most vulnerable populations and as members of the Executive Board, Bangladesh has the responsibility to provide guidance and help WFP deliver on its mandate.





Bangladesh-Italy direct container shipping route opened on 07 February 2022

MV Songa Cheetah, the first direct container ship in Bangladesh-Italy route, left Chattogram Port of Bangladesh for the Port of Ravenna, Italy with 952 TEUs (Twenty-Foot Equivalent Units) of exportables on 07 February 2022. This marks a new chapter in export-import and international maritime trade trajectory of Bangladesh. The ship anchored at NCT-4 jetty of the Chattogram port on 05 February 2022 carrying empty containers after sailing for 19 days since its voyage on 17 January 2022 from the Italian port. H.E. Mr. Charles Whiteley, Ambassador of the European Union





(EU), H.E. Mr. Enrico Nunziata, Ambassador of Italy to Bangladesh and Mr. Faruk Hasan, President of Bangladesh Garments Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) visited the ship at Chattogram Port on 06 February 2022. They described this as the opening of a new horizon for Bangladesh. Italian Ambassador in Dhaka has termed this "as a very good step forward having the vessels coming directly from Europe which will significantly boost export-import trade of RMG products". According to Mr. Md. Omar Faruk, Secretary of Chattogram Port Authority, the new arrangement is expected to reduce transportation costs by 45-50% as the shipping time will be reduced to



15 days from 45 days. Bangladesh enjoys two-way annual bilateral trade of around US\$ 2.3 billion with Italy which is overwhelmingly in favour of Bangladesh. Bangladesh Embassy in

Rome has been pursuing vigorously to enhance bilateral trade including for attracting investment from Italian companies in Bangladesh.

Baghdad University offered ten scholarships for Bangladeshi students

H.E. the Ambassador of Bangladesh to Iraq Mr. Md. Fazlul Bari called on the Honorable President of Baghdad University Prof. Moneer Hameed Tolephih at the latter's office on 08 February 2022. During the meeting, the President of Baghdad University announced 10 scholarships for Bangladeshi students. He also provided photocopies of newspapers from the university archive that published news on the historical visit of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to Iraq in 1974. The University authority also



responded positively to the request of Bangladesh Ambassador for allocating some suitable space for setting up a 'Bangladesh Corner' in its premises.




