First ever Royal VVIP State Visit of His Majesty Sultan of Brunei to Bangladesh took place



Sultan Majesty Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam paid a State Visit to Bangladesh on 15-17 October 2022. His Royal Highness Prince Abdul Mateen accompanied His Majesty Sultan. His Majesty's first State Visit to Bangladesh was at the invitation of the Hon'ble President and the Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh. His Majesty was received at the airport on 15 October 2022 by the Hon'ble President of Bangladesh and was accorded a ceremonial guard of Honour. He paid tribute to the National Martyr's Memorial in Savar on the same day.

During the State visit, His Majesty met with the Hon'ble President and the Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh as well as the Foreign Minister of Bangladesh and discussed matters to strengthen bilateral relations between Bangladesh and Brunei Darussalam, including cooperation in energy, agriculture, food industry, fisheries and connectivity. welcoming ceremony and a State Banquet were hosted by the Hon'ble President in honour of His Majesty. Three Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) on labour, shipping and energy and one agreement on air services were signed during the visit. His Majesty paid rich tribute to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman while visiting the Bangabandhu Memorial Museum. He appreciated visionary leadership of the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and also received appreciation from the Hon'ble Prime Minister for his extraordinary leadership in preserving the stability, peace and prosperity of Brunei Darussalam, and also for extending support to Bangladesh expatriates living and working in Brunei Darussalam.

During the State Visit, from Brunei side, Minister at the Prime Minister's Office and the Minister of Finance and Economy II Dato Seri Setia Dr Awang Haji Mohd Amin Liew bin Abdullah as well as Minister of Home Affairs Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Ahmaddin bin Haji Abdul Rahman attended several side events. These included a business dialogue focusing on exploring ways to strengthen bilateral trade and economic cooperation between Bangladesh and Brunei; the signing of a MoU between Ghanim International Corporation Sdn Bhd and Zes Trading aiming to expand cooperation between the two companies, through the distribution and selling of bruneihalalfoods products in Bangladesh; and the launch of bruneihalalfoods products.



A joint statement was issued at the conclusion of the State visit. Foreign Minister of Bangladesh Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP bade farewell to His Majesty at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport. Also present were Bangladesh High Commissioner to Brunei Darussalam Nahida Rahman Shumona, and High Commissioner of Brunei Darussalam to Bangladesh Haji Haris bin Haji Othman.















Newly appointed Ambassador of UAE presented credentials



The newly appointed Ambassador of the United Arab Emirates Abdulla Ali Abdulla Khaseif Al Hamoudi presented his credentials to the Hon'ble President of Bangladesh on 12 October 2022. During the meeting following presentation of his credentials, Hon'ble President of Bangladesh congratulated UAE for successfully holding the DUBAI EXPO 2020 and thanked the new Ambassador for providing employment opportunity to about 700,000 Bangladeshi nationals. Mentioning their contribution towards the economic development

of both the countries, Hon'ble President requested the Ambassador to consider employing more skilled and semi-skilled workers from Bangladesh and import world class Bangladeshi products. The new envoy admired the socio-economic development of Bangladesh.

Newly appointed High Commissioner of India submitted credentials



Newly appointed High Commissioner of India Mr. Pranay Verma submitted his credentials to the Hon'ble Preisdent of

Bangladesh on 27 October 2022. Welcoming the new High Commissioner, Hon'ble President H.E. Md. Adbul Hamid remarked

that India is a tested friend of Bangladesh. He thanked India for the cooperation extended during the Liberation War of Bangladesh in



1971. Hon'ble President expressed the hope for mutual cooperation between two countries to overcome

the crisis due to COVID19 and Russia-Ukraine war. Indian High Commissioner conveyed that India gives importance to development of bilateral relations and increased cooperation.

Hon'ble Prime Minister gave a keynote speech at the grand opening of the World Food Forum in Rome



Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, on a zoom platform, gave a keynote speech at the grand opening of the World Food Forum (WFF) organized by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), Rome on 17 October 2022 at the FAO Headquarters. In her speech "Agri-food Systems themed on Transformation Bangladesh". the Prime Minister called on the international community to stop war and waste of food highlighting how a fraction of what is spent on weapons manufacturing can end world hunger. The Ukraine-Russia war is taking place at a time when countries in

Africa, South Asia and the Middle East are struggling with droughts in the post-pandemic world, she added. The Prime Minister pointedly mentioned that the planet does not lack food and the scarcity is "simply man-made". She felt that politics and business interests with food, challenges of climate change, and pest and disease attacks were all putting pressure on our agri-food systems. Hon'ble Prime Minister concluded her speech by quoting Bangabandhu's Statement at the UNGA in 1974 which reads as "Let us together create a world that can eradicate poverty, hunger, war and human sufferings and achieve global peace and security for the well-being of humanity." The multi-faceted event, hosted by the FAO, is the second of its kind. Presidents of Honduras, Poland and Sao Tome joined in person while heads of state/government of Panama, Peru and Bangladesh joined digitally at the inaugural session. Bangladesh Delegation, comprising six members and led by Dr. Muhammad Abdur MP, Razzaque, Minister Agriculture attended the inaugural segment of the WFF and the other programs of the WFF's first-ever Investment Forum (17-19 October 2022).

Ministry of Foreign Affairs observed Sheikh Russel Day 2022

At a program organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 18 October 2022 to mark 'Sheikh Russel Day 2022', as Chief Guest, Foreign

Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP remarked, "We do not want to witness such a brutal assassination in this universe anymore. The pledge of the day should be - we shall make a world where not a single child needs to sacrifice its life mercilessly like our little Russel". State Minister for



Foreign Affairs Md. Shahriar Alam, MP attended the program as Special Guest and Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary) Ambassador Masud Bin Momen addressed the audience with his welcome note. At the program, a video message by Kailash Satyarthi, a child right activist and Nobel Laureate was screened as a tribute to Sheikh Russel. The program included placing floral wreath to the portrait of Sheikh Russel, playing of a theme song and a special Dua Mahfil seeking the eternal peace of the departed souls of the martyrs of 15 August 1975 along with Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.













Foreign Minister paid a courtesy call on His Majesty Sultan of Brunei

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP paid a courtesy call on His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah of Brunei who arrived on 15 October 2022 on his first ever visit to Bangladesh.

Welcoming His Majesty the Sultan, Foreign Minister expressed gratitude and happiness at the auspicious visit and said that the visit would take the excellent bilateral relations between the two countries to new heights. Highlighting the phenomenal socio-economic development in Bangladesh under the visionary leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Dr. Momen explained the successful handling of the pandemic in Bangladesh. He also stressed importance of further enhancing the trade between the two countries tapping into the unutilised potentials for mutual benefit. Lauding the contribution of the Bangladeshi expatriates in Brunei to the economy of both Bangladesh and Brunei, Foreign Minister conveyed the readiness of Bangladesh for providing required workforce to Brunei, including professional and skilled human resources. HM the Sultan admired the Bangladeshi expatriate workers in Brunei as hard working and sincere.

Taking part in the discussions, State Minister for Foreign Affairs Mr. Shahriar Alam, MP told HM the Sultan that Bangladesh was ready for attracting FDI and encouraged Bruneian investment in Bangladesh. Pointing to the ongoing inflationary pressures and volatility in the energy sector, Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary) stressed the importance of a stronger bilateral and regional collaboration to cope with the prevailing challenges. HM Sultan expressed his happiness for being able to visit Bangladesh and looked forward to his engagements with Hon'ble President and Hon'ble Prime Minister.









Foreign Minister met with the Foreign Minister II of Brunei Darussalam

Dato Erywan Pehin Yusof, Foreign Minister II of Brunei Darussalam met Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen MP at the State Guest House Padma on 14 October 2022. Welcoming the Bruneian Foreign Minister, Dr. Momen said that the people of Bangladesh were eagerly waiting to accord their heartiest welcome to His Majesty the Sultan of Brunei, who was scheduled to arrive on 15 October 2022 on his first ever visit to Bangladesh. Dr. Momen expressed optimism that the State Visit by HM the Sultan would usher in a new chapter in the excellent bilateral relations between Bangladesh and Brunei. During their talks, the two Foreign Ministers exchanged views on important aspects of the bilateral relations and stressed the importance of further strengthening the level of trade & investment for mutual benefit of the two countries. They agreed to explore new areas of cooperation as well as to enhance connectivity for giving trade, investment, tourism, people-topeople contacts, etc. further boost in the days ahead. They also exchanged views on the challenges brought about by the pandemic and the conflicts in Europe, particularly in the form of food and energy insecurity and supply chain disruptions. Dato Erywan Yusof arrived in Dhaka as a part of the delegation of HM the Sultan of Brunei's State Visit to Bangladesh on 15-16 October 2022. Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary) Ambassador Masud Bin Momen, Secretary (East) Ambassador Mashfee Binte Shams and Ms. Nahida Rahman Shumona, Bangladesh High Commissioner to Brunei were present during the meeting, while Pengiran Norhashima Md Hassan, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Brunei & Haji Haris Bin Othman, High Commissioner of Brunei to Bangladesh accompanied the Bruneian Foreign Minister.





Foreign Minister visited Kazakhstan to attend 6th Summit of CICA

Speech at the Sixth Summit of Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP called for implementation of climate financing pledges commensurate with the principles of loss and damage ahead of the climate conference scheduled

to take place in Sharm El Sheikh in November 2022. He delivered a speech on 13 October 2022 at the Sixth Summit of Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia (CICA) held in Astana, Kazakhstan. Speaking at the forum of the leaders of 27 member countries of CICA, including twelve heads of state or government and two deputy heads of state, he warned of a grim economic future as the



Russia-Ukraine conflict dragged on and continued to disrupt supply chain, cause fuel shortage and price hike. He called for restraints from all parties and a quick and peaceful resolution of the dispute.

Foreign Minister highlighted Bangladesh's deep attachments to promoting peace and cited the flagship resolution that Bangladesh introduced at the UN General Assembly on the Culture of Peace. He reaffirmed Bangladesh's complete commitment to disarmament, including the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons. Seeking support of the CICA leaders in resolving the Rohingya crisis, he stressed that Myanmar must create conducive conditions for the safe,

sustainable, and dignified return of their nationals to Myanmar. At the Summit, the CICA leaders agreed to formally launch the process of upgrading CICA from a forum to an international regional organization and issued a statement titled "Astana Statement on CICA Transformation".





Bilateral meeting with the Foreign Minister of Kyrgyzstan



Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP held a bilateral meeting with the Foreign Minister of Kyrgyzstan Mr. Kulubaev Zheenbek Moldokanovich on the margin of the Sixth Summit of Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia (CICA) held in Astana, Kazakhstan. In the meeting, Mr. Kulubaev showed keen interest to increase trade and investment ties with Bangladesh, especially in the field of textile and garments. Dr.

Momen agreed that there were scopes to improve the business ties between the two countries. He highlighted the strength of the pharmaceutical industry of Bangladesh and its capacity to be a major trading item between the two countries. He also told that Bangladesh had an abundance of talented IT professionals, which Kyrgyzstan can take benefit of. The two Ministers agreed to facilitate communication and interaction between the businesses as well as

the commerce/trade Ministries of the two countries and to explore the possibilities of exchanging business delegations. Both Ministers congratulated each other for the election of their respective countries into the UN Human Rights Council. They expressed satisfaction that Bangladesh and Kyrgyzstan share common views and cooperate with each other on many international issues as members of UN, OIC and NAM.

Meeting with the Foreign Minister of Bahrain

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP held a bilateral meeting with the Foreign Minister of Bahrain Dr. Abdullahtif bin Rashid Al-Zayani on the sidelines of the Sixth Summit of Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia (CICA) held in Astana, Kazakhstan. They discussed various opportunities to further enhance the

ties between Bangladesh and Bahrain. Dr. Momen thanked Bahrain for taking positive initiatives to resolve the issues of Bangladesh expatriate workers who were trying to go back to their workplaces in Bahrain but were unable due to COVID outbreak. He hoped that the remaining workers would also be able to return to their workplace soon. He also called upon

his Bahraini counterpart to facilitate the visas for the family members who got separated due to their expiry of visas while visiting Bangladesh prior to the COVID outbreak. He also asked for easing visas for tourists and businesses. Bahraini Minister assured of his cooperation. He acknowledged that there were disruptions in visa issuance due to COVID-19 and



apprised that the matters are being discussed within the concerned departments in Bahrain now. He

thanked Dr. Abdullahtif for inviting him to the 18th IISS Manama dialogue and expressed his keenness

to join the dialogue and meet the Minister once again in Bahrain to continue their discussions.



Meeting with the Russian Foreign Minister

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP held brief discussions with Russian Foreign Minister Mr. Sergey Lavrov in Astana,

Kazakhstan on the margin of the CICA Summit on 13 October 2022. Dr. Momen apprised him about the current situation of the Rohingya

crisis and stressed the need of stronger international support for resolving the matter.

The visiting Permanent Secretarydesignate of Thailand Mr. Sarun Charoensuwan paid a courtesy call on Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 30 October 2022. During the call on, both the dignitaries exchanged warm greetings on the milestone occasion of the 50 Years of Diplomatic Ties between

Bangladesh and Thailand, which is being celebrated on both sides with fervor and enthusiasm. In his remarks, Foreign Minister shared that Bangladesh is firmly committed



to maintaining cordial and friendly relations with all the neighboring countries in the spirit of its cardinal foreign policy objective of 'friendship to all, malice towards none.' He stressed the importance of forging a stronger and more effective regional collaboration by facilitating greater connectivity in the region. He requested more Thai support and expertise for improving the tourism sector of Bangladesh and encouraged more Thai investment in the infrastructure development initiatives

of Bangladesh, agro-processing sector, health and pharmaceutical sector, etc. Foreign Minister sought a more pro-active role of Thailand in particular, and of the ASEAN in general, for ensuring an expeditious and sustainable repatriation of the displaced Rohingya people sheltered in Bangladesh on humanitarian grounds, to their homeland in Myanmar. Dr. Momen also requested participation of the Thai Foreign Minister & Deputy Prime Minister at the IORA Ministerial meeting

in Dhaka in November 2022. The Thai Permanent Secretary-designate lauded the high growth and massive developmental efforts going in Bangladesh currently, which is rapidly transforming the country. He also emphasized on holding the Joint Commission Meeting at a mutually convenient time at the earliest. He suggested to seriously look into concluding an FTA for further strengthening the bilateral trade and business.

He also briefed the Minister about the progress of the upcoming visit of the Deputy Interior Minister of Saudi Arabia to Dhaka in the second week of November 2022. In response, Foreign Minister expressed readiness and full cooperation from his office in making the visit fruitful. During the meeting, Foreign Minister and Saudi envoy discussed and reviewed various issues of the existing and prospective investment initiatives including power and renewable energy sectors and new proposals under consideration from Saudi Arabia to Bangladesh. Foreign Minister stated that his office was ready to push forward any issues/ proposals from Saudi side in making headways. While reflecting on the current energy/oil crisis in view of the Russia- Ukraine war, Foreign Minister stated that Bangladesh needed brotherly gesture from Saudi Arabia in meeting its energy need and urged the Ambassador to look into the possible Saudi investment in the

LNG sector. The Saudi Envoy stated that he would take up the issue with the concerned Saudi stakeholders. Dr. Momen appreciated the progress and development under the present leadership and welcomed the recent appointment of the Saudi Crown Prince HRH Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz as the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Congratulating the new leadership for his dynamic role for the Muslim world, he stated that our people were looking forward to according a warm welcome to the Prime Minister to Bangladesh. Welcoming the proposal, the Saudi Ambassador underlined the need for the Foreign Minister to undertake a visit to Saudi Arabia which is overdue.

of excellent bilateral engagements between Bangladesh and Qatar in various fields including political, economic, defense, manpower and trade. He thanked Qatar for hosting the Second Foreign Office Consultations (FOC) in Doha in September 2022 adding that the FOC took up for discussion many pertinent issues of our interests including recruitment of manpower including doctors, nurses, engineers, and technicians to Qatar, enhancing the current 'quota of supply' of LNG to Bangladesh, Bangladesh's willingness to contribute to Qatar's food security



through direct supply of food grains agro-products, enhancing bilateral trade and Oatari investment in SEZs and Hi-tech Parks of Bangladesh and a sustainable solution to the Rohingya crisis. The Qatari Ambassador responded that Qatar side was satisfied at the outcome of the FOC and both sides were working on the arrangement of the exchange of high level visit between the two countries' leadership. The Ambassador stated that His Highness the Emir of Oatar was very keen on developing the bilateral relations to new heights and he has accepted the invitation from the President of Bangladesh to undertake a visit to

Dhaka after the FIFA World Cup Tournament. He handed over the official acceptance letter from Qatari Emir to the Foreign Minister for onward transmission to the President.

Foreign Minister appreciated the socio-economic developments that took place in Qatar during the last two decades and Qatar's rapid progress in transforming itself to a modern, developed and forward-looking country. The Minister also expressed gratitude to Qatar for hosting a large number of Bangladesh nationals in Qatar who have been contributing to the socio-economic development of the two countries. He stated that

Bangladesh Government has set up 100 Special Economic Zones where Qatari investors could invest and urged the Ambassador to explore the opportunity to invest in various sectors including the LNG and Power sector. Foreign Minister also appreciated the Qatari leadership for the country's smart preparedness in hosting the World Cup Tournament in Doha in November this year. The Envoy conveyed his eagerness to work more closely with Bangladesh side in the coming days. He handed over a replica of the FIFA World Cup to the Foreign Minister.

Abdul Momen, MP at his office on assumption of his charges in Bangladesh. During the call, Foreign Minister welcomed the new Ambassador. Foreign Minister referred to the traditional excellent relations between Bangladesh and

Libya. Foreign Minister underlined importance of continued cooperation in different sectors of mutual interest including promotion of trade & investment between the two countries and more contacts between the business persons and chamber officials. He suggested forging collaboration in garments, pharmaceuticals and IT sectors and importing the products from Bangladesh including jute and

other produced goods. The Libyan Ambassador suggested forming a Joint Commission to look after major areas of cooperation. Both sides agreed to enhance institutional cooperation like holding Foreign Office Consultations and signing agreements. Foreign Minister sought Libya's continued cooperation in Rohingya issue.





Foreign Minister had a meeting with Lord Karan Bilimoria, a crossbench member of the British House of Lords

Foreign Minister Dr. A. K. Abdul Momen, MP had a meeting with Lord Karan Bilimoria, a crossbench member of the British House of Lords and the President of the Confederation of British Industry, the apex body of British businesses, at his office on 17 October 2022. Dr. Momen recalled with deep gratitude the valuable contributions of the visiting Lord's father, Lt. Gen. Faridoon Bilimoria, an Indian Army officer who commanded the 2/5 Gorkha Rifles (Frontier Force)

in the Rangpur region and fought valiantly during the Bangladesh War of Liberation in 1971. Foreign Minister thanked Lord Bilimoria for promoting the British curry industry, dominated by the British-Bangladesh diaspora. He requested the Lord to use his good offices to address some of the persistent challenges faced by the industry, including for visa in favour of skilled or semi-skilled workers. Foreign Minister Momen also invited new and enhanced investments from the UK, including

in clean energy, ICT and agriculture sectors. Lord Bilimoria briefed the Minister about his proposal for academic and research cooperation between Dhaka University and Birmingham University. Minister Momen commended the Lord's role as the Chancellor of Birmingham University and requested him to explore cooperation with other local Universities, including the Shahjalal University of Science and Technology in Sylhet. They also exchanged views on the developments

Bangladesh bagged a historic win in the UN Human Rights Council election for the term 2023-25





On 11 October 2022 in United Nations General Assembly in New York, Bangladesh bagged a historic win in the election for the membership of the UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC) for the term 2023-25, by securing 160 votes among 189 casted votes. This prestigious win is significant as this was the most competitive international election of all candidatures Bangladesh floated since 2018. Bangladesh, as the highest recipient of votes in Asia Pacific Group, secured one of the four seats in the UNHRC competing



with 7 aspirant countries from the Asia Pacific Group. The other three countries from the region elected were the Maldives (154 votes), Vietnam (145 votes) and Kyrgyzstan (126 votes). Bahrain withdrew their candidature few days ago. Republic of Korea (123 votes) and Afghanistan (12 votes) lost the election. This would be the fifth term of Bangladesh

as the member of the 47-member UNHRC. In the previous UNHRC elections, Bangladesh won in 2006, 2009, 2014 and 2018; effectively for all possible terms as per the rules of business of the Council. The result of this election is a clear manifestation of the recognition by the international community of Bangladesh's continued endeavour

and commitment for the promotion and protection of human rights in national as well as international arena. State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md Shahriar Alam MP has led Bangladesh delegation in the UN General Assembly during the UNHRC election.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs met with his US counterpart Deputy Secretary Wendy R Sherman



State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md. Shahriar Alam, MP held a meeting with his US counterpart Deputy Secretary Wendy R Sherman on 7 October 2022 at the Department of State in Washington, D.C. At the meeting, they discussed various bilateral matters and global issues of common interest. State Minister thanked the US government for extending tremendous support to

Bangladesh by delivering nearly 88 million COVID-19 vaccine doses to fight the pandemic. He also expressed his sincere appreciation for the US humanitarian support to the Rohingyas in Bangladesh and the US efforts to ensure repatriation of Rohingyas to Myanmar. He sought the US support at the WTO on LDC related matters so that countries like Bangladesh could attain a smooth

and sustainable LDC graduation. State Minister Alam expressed his government's willingness to work more closely with the US on the issue of climate change and migration. In this regard, he drew the US attention for an action-oriented discussion on the issue of loss and damage in the upcoming COP-27.



The US Deputy Secretary expressed deep condolences for the loss of three Bangladeshi peacekeepers in the Central African Republic recently. She lauded the contribution of Bangladeshi peacekeepers in global peacekeeping and was also appreciative of Bangladesh's high COVID-19 vaccination rate and measures undertaken by the government to fight and contain the pandemic. The Deputy Secretary appreciated Bangladesh's leadership role in climate change and encouraged Bangladesh to join the Global Methane Pledge prior to COP27.

Referring to the US sanctions on the RAB and its senior officials, the State Minister urged the US government to withdraw the sanctions as soon as possible. Deputy Secretary Sherman reiterated on continued collaboration with Bangladesh on its fight against terrorism and violent extremism. Noting the progress made in the labour sector in Bangladesh, Deputy Secretary Sherman stressed upon strengthening cooperation between the two countries to increase bilateral trade. The war in Ukraine. the issue of food and energy security and the next parliamentary election in Bangladesh were also discussed at the meeting. The State Minister urged the US government to expedite the deportation of Bangabanhu's killer Rashed Chowdhury to Bangladesh mentioning that the issue was of utmost importance to the people of Bangladesh and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina herself. State Minister Alam also emphasized the conclusion of an extradition treaty between Bangladesh and the USA as early as possible.

Later on the day, Rear Admiral Eileen Laubacher, Special Assistant to the US President and incoming Senior Director for South Asia at the White House National Security Council, paid a courtesy call on the State Minister at the Bangladesh in Washington, Embassy Bangladesh-US cooperation counterterrorism. RAB sanctions. Rohingva repatriation. Ukraine war and return of killer Rashed Chowdhury were discussed at that meeting.




