Guidance Notes on the Use of The Standard Tender Document

These guidance notes have been prepared by the CPTU to assist the Procuring Entity in the preparation, using the Standard Tender Document (STD), for the procurement of Goods and Related Services having estimated cost up to BDT 25Lac. The Procuring Entity should also refer to the Public Procurement Act 2006 (Act No 24 of 2006) and the Public Procurement Rules 2008 (PPR2008), issued to supplement the ACT, available on CPTU's website www.cptu.gov.bd/ including amendments thereto. All concerned are advised to refer to the aforementioned Act and Rules while participating in any Tendering process.

STD (PG2) applies when a Procuring Entity wishes to select a Tenderer (a Supplier) for the supply of small value Goods and related services for which the Contract award is being determined on the basis of the lowest evaluated Tender.

This Document may be used for both Open Tendering Method (OTM) and Limited Tendering Method(LTM), whereby Tenders are invited from a list of enlisted Suppliers and is intended for procurement of off-the-shelf readily available Goods under Contracts for short-duration and of low-risks.

The Procuring Entity addresses its specific needs through the information provided in the Tender Data Sheet (TDS) and the Particular Conditions of Contract (PCC) as well as in the detailed requirements of the procurement in the Schedule of Requirements, the Technical Specifications and/orthe Drawings.

Guidance notes in brackets and italics are provided for both the Procuring Entity and the Tenderers and, the Procuring Entity should carefully decide what notes need to remain and what other guidance notes might be required to assist the Tenderers in preparing its Tender Submission so as to minimise an inept Tendering process.

STD (PG2) provides all the information that a Tenderer needs in order to prepare and submit a Tender. This should provide a sound basis on which the Procuring Entity can fairly, transparently and accurately carry out a Tender evaluation process on the Tenders submitted by the Tenderers.

STD (PG2) has 7 Sections, of which Section 1:Instruction to Tenderer and Section 3:General Conditions of Contract must not be altered or modified under any circumstances.

The following briefly describes the Sections of the STD (PG2) and how a Procuring Entity should use these when preparing a particular Tender Document.

Section 1. Instructions to Tenderers (ITT)

The Instruction to Tenderer (ITT) specifies the instructions and procedures that govern the tendering process. This Section also contains the criteria to be used by the Procuring Entity to determine the lowest evaluated Tender and the qualifications of the Tenderer to perform the Contract. The Instructions to Tenderer (ITT) are therefore not a part of the Contract.

Section 2. Tender Data Sheet (TDS)

The Procuring Entity shall specify in the TDS only the information that the ITT instructs to be specified in the TDS. To facilitate the preparation of the TDS, its Clause Numbers are numbered with the same numbers of the corresponding ITT Clauses.

Section 3. General Conditions of Contract (GCC)

This Section provides the General Conditions of Contract that will apply to the Contract for which the Tender document is issued.

Section 4. Particular Conditions of Contract (PCC)

This Section provides clauses specific to the particular Contract that modify or supplement Section 3: General Conditions of Contract. The Procuring Entity should include at the time of issuing the Tender Documents all possible information that the GCC indicate, shall be provided in the PCC. Its Clause Numbers are numbered with the same numbers of the corresponding GCC Clauses.

Section 5. Tender & Contract Forms

Tender Forms

This Section provides the standard form for the Tender Submission Letter (Form PG2-1), Price Schedule (Form PG2-2) Specifications Submission and Compliance Sheet (Form PG2-3), Bank Guarantee for Tender Security, (Form PG2-4) when applicable, and Bank's Letter of Commitment for Line of Credit (Form PG2-5) to be submitted by the Tenderer.

These forms along with required documents mentioned in the ITT will constitute the Tender, to be submitted by the Tenderers.

Contract Forms

This Section also contains the form of the Notification of Award (Form PG2-6), Contract Agreement (Form PG2-7) and forms of Bank Guarantee for Performance Security (Form PG2-8) as and if applicable, is to be completed and furnished by the successful Tenderer, when required.

Section 6. Schedule of Requirements

This Section provides the List of Goods and Delivery Schedule and List of Related Services and Completion Schedule and must be carefully prepared by the Procuring Entity for each object of procurement. The purpose of the Schedule of Requirements is to provide information to enable the Tenderer to prepare their Tenders accurately, in particular, the Price Schedule, for which the Price Schedule (Form PG2-2) is provided.

Section 7. Technical Specifications

This Section provides the detailed Technical Specifications that describe the Goods and related services to be procured.
